TITLE IX DISCRIMINATION <u>DISMISSAL</u> FORM

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. § 1681) is a federal law that prohibits discrimination based on sex in educational institutions that receive federal financial assistance. A Complaint of sex-based discrimination may be dismissed if the district is unable to identify the respondent after taking reasonable steps to do so; the respondent is not enrolled in or employed by the district; the complainant voluntarily withdraws their complaint and the Title IX Coordinator determines that without the Complainant's allegations the conduct would not constitute sex discrimination; or even if proven, the allegations in the complaint would not constitute sex discrimination (after making reasonable efforts to clarify the allegations with the complainant).
